Portland Senior Tax Equity Program (P-STEP)

Application Instructions

The Portland Senior Tax Equity Program (P-STEP) provides tax relief to low-income seniors who live in the City of Portland. To qualify, applicants must be 62 years of age or older with a homestead in Portland. Applicants must also have received a Maine Property Tax Fairness Credit in the tax year prior to the P-STEP application. If you do not qualify or did not receive a rebate under the State program you will not be eligible for the City of Portland P-STEP. The application period for the City of Portland program runs from January 01, 2023 and July 31, 2023. Application instructions are below:

1. The program application is available at City Hall or [online](#).
2. Attach a *signed* copy of your 2022 Form 1040ME, **including** Schedule PTFC (Property Tax Fairness Credit).

4. Application period for the 2022 tax year runs from January 01, 2023 through July 31, 2023. Please remember that you must complete an application *every year* in order to participate in the program. You must also receive the Property Tax Fairness Credit for the tax year prior to the application year in order to be eligible for the City of Portland program. You may be asked to provide proof of the property tax paid, copies of rent receipts or canceled checks, and copies of the State refund received before a municipal refund is issued.

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P-STEP Frequently Asked Questions

What is the age requirement? Applications for the 2022 tax year will only be considered from those who were age 62 or older by December 31, 2022. For homes owned jointly, only one of the applicants must be over the age limit.

What if I haven't filed my State Income Tax forms yet (Form 1040ME)? You must wait until you have completed your 2022 1040ME and it has been accepted by the State, including Schedule PTFC (Property Tax Fairness Credit) before you apply for the City's program. Proof of the PTFC may be requested by the City prior to credit or refund being granted.

I rented for part of the year and owned my own home for part of the year. Am I eligible for a refund? Yes, if you otherwise qualify. List the tax assessed for the part of the year you owned and occupied your own home and claim the amount of rent you paid for the portion of the year you rented. Remember that each home must have been your primary home during each time period.

Do I have to provide my phone number and what will it be used for? Yes, we must have a daytime phone number provided in case we have questions about your application. We will not call unless we require additional information. We will not give out your phone number to any other party or agency.

Will I automatically be sent an application next year? Yes, if you qualified for a refund this year, we will automatically send you an application next January. Applications will be available online at www.portlandmaine.gov and also in the Treasury and Assessors offices on the first floor of City Hall at 389 Congress Street.

How much benefit am I eligible for? Program benefit to an eligible applicant shall be the lesser of the following amounts: (a) The amount of credit the applicant qualified for under the state PTFC program; (b) Twelve hundred dollars (\$1,200.00); or (c) A prorated share of available monies in the P-STEP program fund based on the amount of each eligible applicant's credit under the state program.

Will I Receive a check? For eligible applicants who have property taxes due, the payment will be applied to the outstanding balance. If there are no property taxes due, a check will be mailed to the applicant.
