Plano Sanitary Sewer Overflow

The City of Plano is monitoring a sanitary sewer overflow due to an issue with a North Texas Municipal Water District lift station. The estimated overflow volume surpassed 100,000 gallons at 6:15 pm.

The Plano Public Works Department reported a sanitary sewer manhole near 5510 W. Plano Pkwy near White Rock Creek overflowed due to a pump and motor failure at the Water District facility. The City received an alarm from its flow monitoring system at 2:40 pm that the manhole was approaching overflow. A crew verified it at 2:50 pm. NTMWD initiated actions to identify the issue and is coordinating bypass pumping to facilitate repairs and convey sewer flows.

We estimate the flow 500 gallons per minute. We believe more than 100,000 gallons flowed into White Rock Creek. Once the flow is contained, Plano Public Works Department personnel will walk the creek to verify no adverse effects to water or aquatic life.

Although the City of Plano has experienced this leak of domestic wastewater, the public drinking water is not affected and continues to be safe for consumption. The City has notified the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality regarding the spill.
