Foreword





We express our gratitude to her with whom we are happy to share our graduation.




HUGH J. EISENHAUER

Watertown High will remember him most for his friendliness and his co-operation.




JOHN F. CRAIG


To Mr. Craig we extend our sincere wishes for success in his hobby of designing Cape Cod cottages.





It's fun to look back, isn't it? Remember our first day of high school life when we sat in our homerooms quivering with excitement and when we wandered around the corridors lost and perplexed?



Do you think a severe snow storm could keep sophomores away from the high school on the twenty-first of January? Indeed not! That was the night of our class party.




affairs between her easy-going mother, Dorothy Wallace, and her stern, but likeable father, Walter Stewart.


