Re: Discontinuance of Contracts to Support Southwest Border Humanitarian Effort

The Grants Management and Innovation Office (GMI) has advised that available federal and state funds used to pay for the costs associated with the temporary sheltering, transportation and assistance of Legally Processed Asylum Seekers (LPAS) will be nearly exhausted by March 31, 2024.

This notice is being provided for distribution to the Board of Supervisors in accordance with BOS Policy D29.4(XV) – Contract Termination.

On February 29, 2024, the Pima County Health Department issued the attached notice of intent to terminate effective March 15, 2024 Contract MA-PO-22-030 with Jot Properties, LLC for Hotel Shelter Services for COVID Positive Asylum Seekers pursuant to the agreement's termination provisions.

In addition, services ordered under the following contracts will be discontinued between March 31 and April 5, 2024, and the contracts will not be renewed beyond their current contract terms:
