


Foreword







The soccer team has had its most successful season since its introduction at Watertown High by Coach Craig. More boys reported for practice this year

than in any previous year.

During the regulation season the boys played twelve games which resulted in eleven victories and one tie. With a record such as this, the team was recognized as the Greater Boston champions. The United States Soccer-Football Association was about to present the state championship cup to New Bedford Vocational School when Coach Craig was urged to pit his boys against the last year's champions. Although the team had not played for six weeks, the season ending at Thanksgiving, Mr. Craig finally consented to a game. Watertown traveled to New Bedford and, under extremely unfavorable conditions, lost the game by a wide margin. Although ten lettermen returned, Coach Ward had to instil confidence into a team which, in previous years, had been consistently beaten. Led by Captain "Jug" Piantedosi, the team played a hard schedule, emerging victor

in four contests, losing three, and tying two.

The season was opened at Norwood with a 2 to 0 defeat in a close struggle with a far heavier team. A decisive win over Gloucester was then followed by an uphill victory over Melrose. Wins over Dedham and Winthrop were combined, in the next four games, with a tie with the strong Wakefield team and a defeat at the hands of Waltham. By playing two games on one Saturday, the team lost its opportunity to grasp the Mystic Valley crown. Faced with a conflicting schedule, Coach Ward was forced to send a third team to Arlington to play the league champions.

After losing a poorly played contest to Woburn, the team climaxed the season by tying the undefeated Belmont team on Thanksgiving. Although the surprised Belmont team made the first score, a score in which the officials were admittedly at fault, the passing of Prendergast to Daughters and Piantedosi brought

the tying tally, shortly before the game ended.



GIRLS' TENNIS


Practice for the girls' tennis team has been conducted regularly in the gym

The schedule consists of two games with each of the following schools: Belmont, Waltham, Newton, Exeter Academy, Arlington, and Norwood.




OUTDOOR TRACK


